Dear Brothers and Sisters,



It is a grace to be with you and have the pleasure to serve you as your pastor. From the time, just before my ordination as a priest in 2011, I made a commitment to embrace the "example" presented in a simple woodcut, *The Washing of the Feet*, by Albrecht Dürer. The image was then chosen as the central feature of one of the prayer cards

offered to the faithful on the day of my ordination. For me, the image expressed the passion that Our Lord had for Peter, His desire to serve his "intimate ones," His desire to serve the least. It also shows Peter's desire for Our Lord and his own sanctification. It became the daily reminder of why I wanted to serve the Church: "If I don't wash...you have no inheritance." If I don't serve, I'm risking the salvation of those around me. That passion is what you and I are aiming for as men and women open to the good news of Christ Jesus. He is ever before us, inviting you and me to serve. I don't come to you as a priest with a "plan," with a "solution," with anything other than *my presence* and my desire to help save souls. I desire to "know" the parish and you as individuals.

I grew up in a military family that landed in Chester in the 80s, I was formed St. Ann's, Colonial Heights and graduating from Thomas Dale High School. I attend VCU for college and then served as a domestic missionary for a year before working as a youth minister at Our Lady of Lourdes the following year. During my time in the parish, I applied to the seminary and attended St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, MD. After ordination, I served at St. Bridget for

one year and then was pastor of St. Joseph until 2021. During that time, I studied Canon Law at the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC, served as the Associate Director of Vocations and then was appointed Vicar for Vocations. In 2021 I became fulltime Vicar for Vocations and Interim Director of Worship and lived at St. Paul's.

In addition to my new role as pastor of the cluster parishes, Judicial Vicar and Chancellor, I remain the Bishop's Delegate for the communities around the diocese attached to the Traditional Latin Mass. It has been my practice to visit these communities from time-to-time. I ask for your patience as I navigate new roles and integrate into the varied communities of the cluster parishes.

Where we can maintain, and even increase, the pastoral efforts within the communities, I want to see that happen, but in the coming months there may also need to be adjustments to the liturgical and administrative expectations and offerings within the cluster. Please do not read that I'm implying there will be changes, only that we will need time to discern together how the schedule and offerings might need to be tweaked to maximize our shared apostolic labors for the proclamation of the Gospel in our parishes. Where I can be present in the coming months, I hope to be; please don't shy away because you think: "He is too busy." I don't have unlimited reserves, but I desire to be present to you and for you as needs dictate.

Please be assured of my daily prayers and weekly Masses for your intentions in *pro populo* Masses offered on Sundays and other holy days.
