## Message from Our Pastor

In our first reading this weekend, we hear from the prophet Zechariah, it is a prominent passage that we hear each year during the holy Season of Lent, principally on Palm Sunday. It serves as a useful "tool," as I like to say, for understanding the, sometimes confusing, texts of Sacred Scripture. So very often, Our Lord likes to offer us "hard sayings" that can be difficult to incorporate into daily living, due to the fact that that our lives, the daily activities that fill our days, are mixed with both graces, and the sin that distracts.

To "combat" the confusion that disrupts our intentions to "live well," Our Lord provides "hard sayings" to get us to reconsider our "daily operations." He provides time to "rethink" what we are about, what we should do to conduct ourselves in a way that might be in accord with a time of grace.

In the "prophecy," commonly known as the "first reading" we hear of the prominent image of the Lord riding into the city on the colt – the people singing "Hosanna" – a descriptive image of what would become the liturgical procession that makes up the first day of Holy Week and opens us up to the Passion Reading of Palm Sunday.

The Lord rides into the Holy City, in a regal, yet simple way.

How do you ride into the significant moments of your life? Receiving the Lord into the core of your life, how might you conduct yourselves amongst your daily duties?

What we hear very clearly from the Lord is an invitation to enter into the "messiness" of life

with heads held high because we willingly "receive" from the Lord the gift of our "exalted" status as sons and daughters – entering in "riding" and not "walking," while "entering" on a "colt" and not a "horse," meaning – entering in simply so that we might "see" the needs of others and being men and women able to have the affective maturity of sons and daughters who are attentive to the needs of others.

This week, can you be attentive to the invitation to "hold your head high" in the midst of difficulties and simultaneously be open to the weakness of others, striving to find a way to lift others up? - Fr. Capuano
